1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) unit at V C College, Karads conducted comprehensive Weapon Training (WT) on 31 December 2025 under expert guidance from 19 Maharashtra Battalion NCC, Karad. The activity focused on hands-on training with rifles, including firing exercises and weapon maintenance—fundamental skills essential for NCC cadet development. This report documents the successful execution of the Weapon Training activity as per NCC curriculum guidelines and military standards.

2. OBJECTIVES OF THE ACTIVITY

The Weapon Training (WT) activity was conducted with the following objectives:

- **To develop weapon handling proficiency:** Imparting practical knowledge of rifle characteristics, operation, and safe handling
- **To ensure firearm safety discipline:** Instilling strict adherence to safety protocols and weapon management procedures
- **To build firing accuracy and precision:** Developing marksmanship skills through structured firing exercises and target practice
- **To enhance maintenance capabilities:** Training cadets in weapon care, cleaning, and maintenance procedures

- **To develop military discipline:** Fostering discipline, focus, and responsibility through hands-on weapon training
 - **To build confidence and composure:** Developing psychological readiness and trigger discipline under supervised conditions
 - **To align with NCC curriculum:** Fulfilling mandatory Weapon Training components as per National Cadet Corps syllabus and Defense Ministry guidelines
 - **To prepare for advanced training:** Establishing foundational skills for advanced military training and operational readiness
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3. ACTIVITY DESCRIPTION

3.1 Weapon Training Components

The Weapon Training activity encompassed comprehensive instruction and practical application covering multiple aspects of rifle operations:

Rifle Characteristics and Specifications:

- Study of .22 Rifle and 7.62 SLR (Self Loading Rifle) specifications
- Understanding ammunition types and ballistic characteristics
- Knowledge of effective range and weapon capabilities
- Familiarization with rifle components and mechanical operation

Weapon Handling and Operation:

- Correct grip, holding, and positioning techniques
- Loading and cocking procedures
- Trigger operation and firing mechanisms
- Unloading and weapon safety procedures
- Sight setting and adjustment procedures

Firing Positions and Techniques:

- Standing position for firing
- Kneeling position for stability
- Lying position for maximum accuracy
- Transition between firing positions
- Aiming techniques and target acquisition
- Snap shooting and grouping theory

Weapon Maintenance and Care:

- Stripping and assembly of rifles
- Cleaning procedures and maintenance protocols
- Care of weapon components

- Periodic cleaning schedules (weekly, monthly, quarterly)
- Storage and preservation of weapons

Practical Firing Exercises:

- Grouped shooting exercises for accuracy assessment
- Target practice at standard ranges
- Observation and scoring of shot grouping
- Development of consistent shooting technique
- Feedback and performance evaluation
