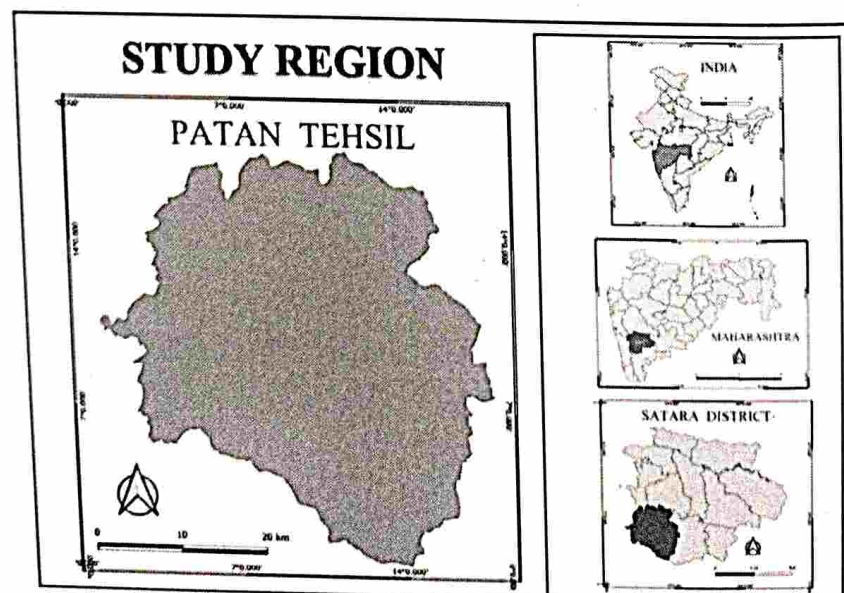
## Objectives:
